## "BUILDING A BETTER BLACKVILLE"

Leaders of organizations in the Blackville Community and concerned citizens met on October 10, 2013 at the Community Center to discuss ways of improving our town.

Presentation bv Gwendolvn Littleiohn. President of Blackville Downtown Development Association, explained the purpose for the meeting and advised that working together as a community, we can achieve our goals.

Mayor Michael Beasley talked to the group about what it takes to "Build a Better Blackville" and asked, What Is the vision for Blackville as a whole? He stated Blackville is a goldmine waiting to happen and that citizens need to raise their expectations. The Mayor told the group the town is willing to work with any organization for the improvement of Blackville. Some suggestions were to have the organizational meetings monthly at the Blackville Community Center, develop a support system, and to attend the monthly Town Council meetings. The Mayor asked for a commitment from the group to come and work together to make Blackville a better place to live.

Lacinda McCormack, a member of Barnwell County Transportation Board, advised the county receives "C" funds from the state every month to pave dirt roads in the county. A rightof-way form must be signed by all occupants on the road before paving is allowed.

Rick Carter of the Greater Savannah Regional Community Foundation told the group about the Frank and Lucy Hartzog Foundation. Scholarships that are available for students

near the Hilda area which includes a portion of Blackville and Barnwell.

Jada Smalls, one of our youngest attendees, questioned programs/activities for our youth.

Terrance Washington expressed the importance of citizens supporting the various festivals in town.

A discussion ensued in reference to electrical capabilities in the downtown area, buildian Harrison suggested that all organizations. Lillian Harrison suggested that all organizations make a commitment to assist the town in upgrading the electrical system. Councilman Isaac advised that the Town Supervisor is working on an estimate to upgrade electricity in the area.

Libby Still informed the audience of a state project to save historical trees. In the county 8 efforts are being made to identify historical places and trees that need to be documented. She suggested a tree be planted near the railroad bed to represent Blackville's history as a railroad town.
